1. Welcome & Apologies

A Crockett welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced, new full member Libby Elliot and Ellie Pay, Cupar Youth Cafe representative.

2. Declarations of interest

There were no declarations of interest intimated.

3. **Opening remarks - Chair's Report**

Chair welcomed new members to the meeting and hope each would feel able and comfortable in contributing to the discussions and also bringing items to the community council's attention.

The Remembrance Service had gone well and the CC laid wreaths at the War Memorial and also at the grave of Charles Jarvis VC at the cemetery.

The Christmas lights switch on had been well received albeit this year there were no nominations for citizen of the year, re switching the lights on.

6. Matter arising from monthly meeting

- a) <u>Christmas Tree</u> advised via Cllrs that timescales hadn't allowed sufficient lead in time to install electrical connections and prepare site. This will be followed up for next year. Noted suggestion from CC that a solar lights installation may be appropriate.
- b) <u>ATS Display Panels Refresh</u> treasurer had met with D Kirk, panels to be replaced re content, refreshed. CC provision of £2,700 to support project. Likelihood to be actioned in the first quarter of 2026.
- c) <u>Hogmanay Ceilidh</u> George Sharp, organiser had reported that the hall & Band were both re-booked in January 2025 along with the

Piper, and he has ordered the Posters & the Tickets to be printed by YMCA. (Ticket prices same as last Year).

Tickets go on sales on Saturday December 13th @ 9.30am in Corn Exchange, nothing else to do until December 31st @ 6 /6.30pm when the doors open at the Corn Exchange & the families start to arrive ready for 8pm.

d) War Memorial Lights - Community Manager had advised Cllrs and community council that feedback from Property Services colleagues indicated that there is a break in the power line supplying the War Memorial lights, and its repair is the responsibility of SP Energy Networks. Unfortunately, works to reinstate the supply will involve partially digging up the road. Given the already significant travel disruption across the town due to various roadworks, it's not likely that this work will be undertaken until such time as the other works are finished. At this stage there is no timescale for this.

7. Members of the Public

Comment re the desire for a Xmas tree at ATS and that solar lighting would be appropriate, if achievable - noted.

Museum had now closed for the 2025 Season - successful year, noting the Curling Exhibition had created footfall from local curling enthusiasts and further afield.

Museum open April 2026 - noted Sugar Beet exhibition and also Elmwood College - call for materials, photos and associated information. Centenary of the Beet Factory 1926-2026.

8. Citizen of the Year

Chair reported that there had been no nominations for Citizen of the Year. After discussion agreed that a sub-group would be convened August 2026 to start to progress next year's nominations, publicity and criteria. Noted social media could benefit awareness and encouraging interest, recognition.

9. Haugh Park - Culvert

D Provan reminded members that a report re the condition of the culvert was overdue. Agreed Douglas would write to Fife Council and ask for further update. Discussions and the need for repairs have been ongoing since 2014, lack of progress, identified funds has been a source of frustration and disappointment.
